The Dillard's rock & bluegrassbergers encapsulated Castle Creek until local enthusiast showed up on the last set to sound better than their albums for once.

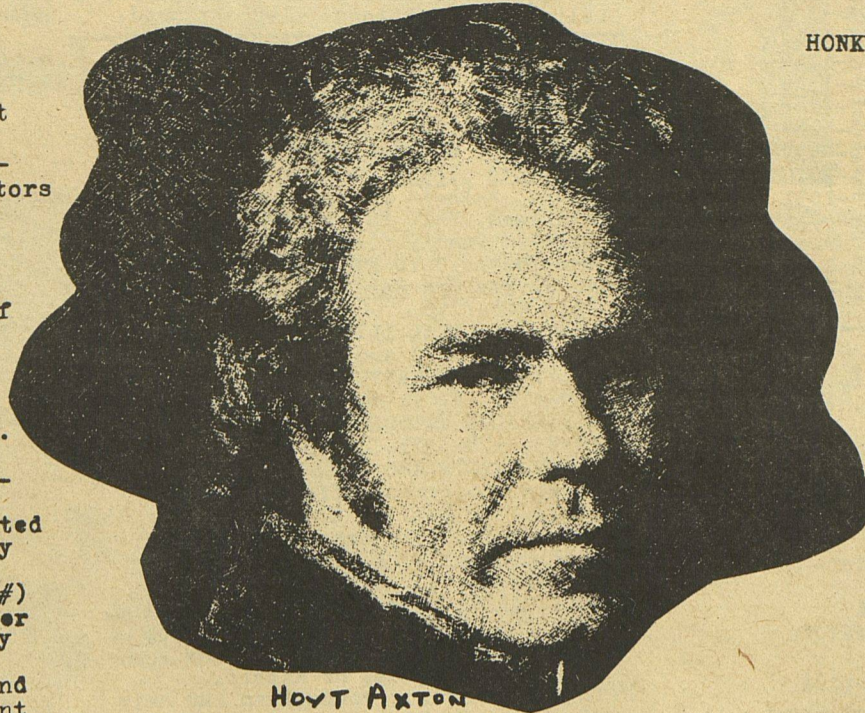

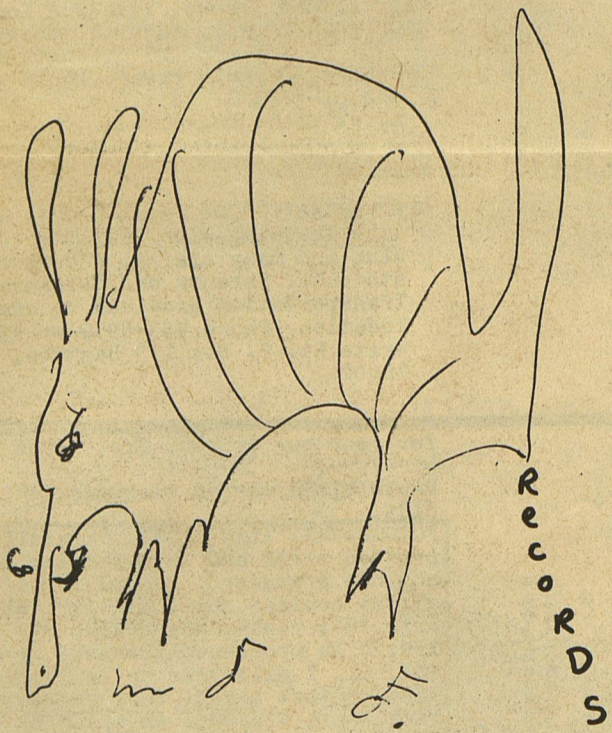

a hit in Houston, sounds kinda like Van Morrison and young dylan-esque, jazzy rock variable B "New York Serenade" nice...

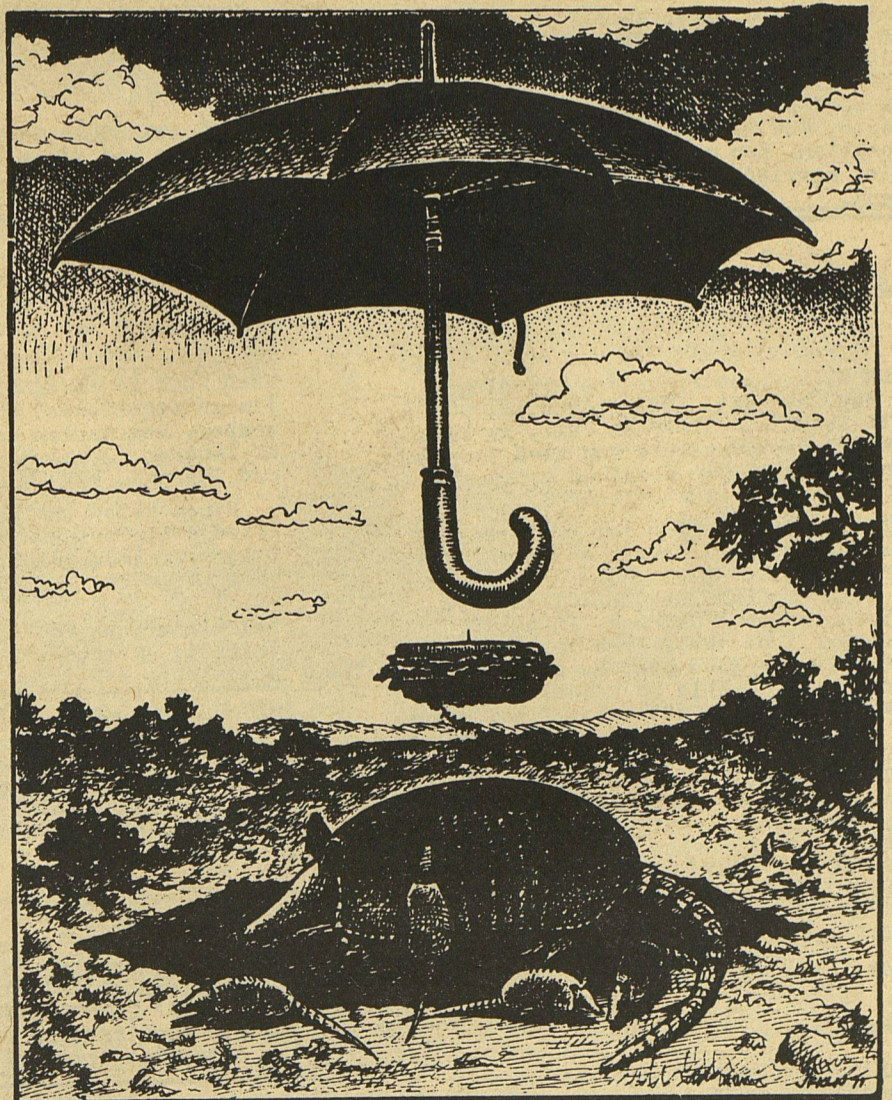
Pretzel Logic - Steely Dan
