Van Zandt, McClinton stands open lively week

The coming week is a lively one for Austin country music fans, and it starts early with Thursday through Saturday performances by Towns Van Zandt at the Montana Mining Co. North and by Delbert McClinton at Soap Creek Saloon.

It's sort of a homecoming for Towns, who moved to Austin about two years ago but has spent the past two summers in Colorado. McClinton has been closed for almost two weeks for remodeling. Reopening with Towns, whose "Bad as Luffy and Pancho" is being sung by artists all over the nation, is a continuation of the astute business it has exhibited in recent months.

Fort Worth's bluesy Delbert McClinton has been gaining Austin fans rapidly, and his filming of a KLRN "Austin City Limits" television show was a masterpiece. Two songs which he wrote have been particularly popular, "Heavy Toker" (I Guess I've Done Me Some), a recent single release, and "Victim of Life's Circumstances," the title cut of his album.

The crowded week continues with the Outlaw Concert outdoors Sunday. Then Monday Willie Nelson opens a four-night stand at Soap Creek Saloon, and David Allan Coe comes in for two nights at Alliance Wagon Yard, while Ernest Tulin is scheduled to appear outdoors Wednesday at the International Speedway north of Georgetown.

COUNTRY CONCERT

It's a shame that Sunday's scheduled country music Outlaw Concert on the Steiner ranch has been marred by controversy over the recent rock music concert held there. I talked with Larry Trader, representative of the producers, just before writing this column. "We are asking every agency involved and every individual to tell us exactly what they want done to please them — then we are going to do it," Larry said.

The producers say they are willing to do everything possible to eliminate any objections to the concert. This would include traffic problems and security for property of neighbors.

I specifically asked Larry what would be done to protect the boats of those who choose to go to the Lake Austin site by water, a suggestion I made in this column last week. He told me that boat owners would be given a numbered ticket, similar to those used in auto parking lots, and that no one would be allowed near a boat without that claim check.

The concert starts at 10 a.m. and features 20 acts, headlined by Willie Nelson, Waylon Jennings, Tracy Nelson, Asleep at the Wheel and David Allan Coe.
