There are many bridges spanning the Rhine and the Seine rivers, but only a few connect the Rhine to the Seine. These connecting bridges have been built by three German-Jewish emigrants to France during the 19th century: Heinrich Heine, Giacomo Meyerbeer and Jaques Offenbach.

The opera "Les Contes d'Hoff-(The Tales of Hoffmann) is one of the strange flowers of this symbiosis. Performed posthumously in Paris in 1881, this opera was an instant success and had to be repeated 101 times. The reasons are not hard

His technique of dissolving time and space, and of vaccillating between fantasy and reality are the very foundations upon which all modern cinematic techniques are built.
