Reviewing the Records

THE BRILLIANT artistry of pianist Artur Rubenstein is never more apparent than in his recent recording of the Schubert Sonata in B Flat on the RCA Victor label (LSC 3122). The disc represents the fourth waxing of the work by Mr. Rubenstein but the first three were never released because of his dissatisfaction with them.

The jacket comment notes that Mr. Rubenstein believes that the sonata's ultimate beauty is beyond a single performer's abil-ity to completely realize but, his many fans will certainly agree, he comes close enough for us.
