Specialties — The specialty of the week is music but, ooh, what a tough choice to make. On the one hand, blues guitarist John Lee Hooker will headline two shows at 7 and 10 p.m. Friday at Slubb's Barbecue. On the other hand, Townes Van Zandt, who has only written tunes like "Pancho And Lefty" (recorded by Don Williams and Merle Haggard) and "If I Needed You" (recorded by Don Williams and Emmylou Harris), is set to perform both Friday and Saturday at The Texas Spoon. Van Zandt is not the best vocalist you'll ever hear, but Lloyd Maines hit it on the head when he told me the songwriter's folk performances "have a soulful feeling." Tickets are priced at \$7 to see Hooker at Slubb's; the Spoon has put a \$1 cover into effect for Van Zandt's performances.

Sports — This weekend's best bet is Saturday afternoon's regionally televised basketball game matching Texas Tech against the Texas A&M Aggies. The Raiders, 9-7 going into last night's game against Baylor, will try to keep the 11-7 Aggies from breaking into the Southwest Conference's upper echelon.
