Men To Hold Flower Show

Lavender, pink, yellow, white and bronze chrysanthemums, orchids and other cut flowers will be displayed at the 30th annual Men's Garden Club of Austin and the Second Annual Capital Area Chrysanthemum Society Flower Show.

The Fall Flower Shows will be open 2-7 p.m. Saturday and 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Sunday at the Austin Area Garden center in Zilker Gardens. Admission is free to the public.

At the "Carroll of Flower" exhibition, members of the Chrysanthemum Society will display six varieties of mums. A unique "Texas Gold" mum, the seeds of which were obtained in Japan, will be displayed at the 3-day show.
