George Kaywood, business manager of WONY, said this week "what this country needs is a good five-cent concert, and WONY is bringing that to Oneonta."

The Mandrake Memorial has performed in the eastern United States where they have received rave notices. Record World described the group in its review of their Carnegle Hall concert as "Poppy's incredible psychedelic rock trio, which remains one of the most under-rated American groups."

Townes Van Zandt is a slim poet-folksinger from Texas who composes tunningly brilliant ballads about very simple things: goin' out to Denver; his loving a Colorado girl; columbines; love's quicksilver bittersweetness and "how soft the time flies past your window at night."
