

Rock Concert at Coe

Station KCOE-FM, in association with Poppy Records, will present a rock concert featuring The Mandrake Memorial and Townes Van Zandt Tuesday night, April 21, at 8 p.m. in Sinclair auditorium.

This concert is part of a nationwide college tour co-sponsored by Poppy Records and college radio stations throughout the United States.

The Mandrake Memorial has until this time performed mostly in the eastern United States where they have been received with almost unanimously rave notices.

Record World described the group in its review of their Carnegie Hall concert as "Poppy's incredible psychedelic rock trio, which remains one of the

most under-rated American groups. They produce symphonic sound which forms into the beautiful escapist movements of their endless rock concerto. Their leader is really their drummer and their sound is of the future."

Townes Van Zandt is a slim poet-folksinger from Texas who composes ballads about very simple things: Goin' out to Denver; his loving a Colorado girl; columbines; love's quicksilver bittersweetness and "how soft the time flies past your window at night."
