

One word for Ziegfeld TV show: Interminable

NEW YORK (UPI) — When we kids were at the movies, all the little boys used to groan at the love scenes and mutter, "mush." I used to moan at the production numbers and grumble "slush."

For those who agree that chorus rhymes with bore us; don't watch. "Ziegfeld: the Man and his Women," which NBC will show tomorrow night from 8 to 11. The word that most accurately describes the show is interminable.

It features 15 musical numbers, including one with bubble-like balloons that single-handedly could have killed the revue-style musical theater.

The story of Florenz Ziegfeld and his theatrical follies, not to mention his amorous follies (some of which starred the same women) is told by his mother; his first wife, Anna Held; his mistress, Lillian Lorraine; his second wife, Billie Burke; dancer Marilyn Miller, who was no fan, and his daughter, who loved him.

According to this version, he was the kind of man only a mother or a daughter could love — otherwise he was a selfish, ambitious womanizer who was unscrupulous about money, contracts and almost everything else.

He also was the super showman of the early 20th century who provided a Broadway showcase for Eddie Cantor, Fanny Brice, Will Rogers and the musical talents of Irving Berlin and George Gershwin, among others.

The stars include Paul Shenar in the title role, with Barbara Parkins,

Valerie Perrine, Samantha Eggar and Pamela Peardon among the women in his life. The best moment in the show includes none of these — it is when Dan Tullis belts out "Old Man River" from "Showboat."

Ziegfeld and his Follies may be among the ancestors of the Las Vegas girlie show, in which he has a lot to answer for — including the pilot of "Legs," which will become a regular half-hour series on the NBC schedule next fall.

The hour-long pilot went on last night. The show boasts Marcia Lewis as a fat Vegas comedienne who wants to bring up her son in a normal manner despite the Vegas atmosphere, which includes sharing an apartment with two showgirls.

This show will appeal to those who want to watch good-looking girls, some without brassieres. It will also appeal to the subtle swooners who sigh over Scott Baio as the son. Baio already has a following as Fonzi's nephew on "Happy Days."

The comedy depended on lines like, "I love the milkmen in Las Vegas — they'll shoot you double or nothing for cottage cheese."

Lines — or lack of them — also are the problem in ABC's "The Paul Lynde Comedy Hour," that goes on tonight at 8 o'clock with guests Harry Morgan, Juliet Prowse and Brenda Vaccaro.

The gimmick is that Lynde has the power to grant his own and his guests' wishes — although of course the results are far from happy. The same goes for the script, which gives these pleasant performers little to work with in a series of skits.

Taunton stations in conflict

In this area, radio ratings battles and accompanying psychological warfare are usually associated with the downtown Boston stations. However, there's a unique conflict taking place in the not-too-far commuting suburb of Taunton.

Radio station WRLM-FM (93.3) filed formal protest with the Federal Communications Commission over the extended operation of "daytime only" rival WPEP (1570 AM) during the February blizzard.

Jim Dixon, WPEP operations director explained that, from February 8 through February 12, the station remained on the air to provide "essential storm information in both English and Portuguese." Under its broadcast license, WPEP must ordinarily sign-off at sundown each night.

Despite the then-declared government state of emergency, WRLM-FM Vice President and General Manager Joseph G. Quill asked the FCC to investigate what he termed "the unnecessary nighttime operation." He specifically claimed that the continuous WPEP broadcast "seriously violated the law."

Competitor Quill bases his contention on the fact that WPEP did not initiate its 24-hour service until two days after the February 5 storm began — which he considers well after the real emergency was over.

WPEP owner John F. Crohan, however, calls the charges "unjustified, untrue, and replete with sub-

jective commentary and speculation." He indicates that his station purposely did not extend its air operations until permission to do so was granted by FCC National Emergency Broadcasting supervisor Art Radtze.

The FCC has given WPEP until May 26 to file its response to the WRLM-FM complaint.

DIAL TWISTING:

More on-again, off-again big band music returns to WHET (1330 AM) next Monday when announcer Bette Day starts a new 8 p.m. to midnight shift. Day attributes her reassignment to the "tremendous public and sponsor response." She will take over the broadcast hours of fellow dee jay Bill Marlowe, who will switch to the wide-eyed 5:30 a.m. to 9:30 a.m. stint.

Tomorrow at 12:30 p.m. WGBH-FM (89.7) will broadcast the full hearing of the visiting Carnegie Commission's examination into the future of public broadcasting. The discussion, one of a series of public meetings being held across the country, will be audiotaped today when the Commission meets at the Harvard Faculty Club at 9:30 a.m. Among those expected to testify are Frank Mankiewicz, president of National Public Radio, and Bonnie Cronin, general manager at WBUR-FM.

Finally, effective Wednesday, rocker WRKO (680 AM) will join the ABC Contemporary Radio Network. The service offers the 50,000 watt station over-night news feeds, and commercials during the day.
