Festival theme 'Seven Flags Over Marshall'

MARSHALL — Stagecoach Days '80 set to begin Friday, has adopted "Seven Flags Over Marshall" as its theme.

The annual festival celebrates the city's rich history and its role as a transportation center. Seven different flags, beginning with Spain, proceeding through the Confederacy and ending with the United States, have flown over the historic city since its founding.

Among the festivities planned for this year's Stagecoach Days are home tours, a four-mile run, a crafts fair on the square, a play and a concert by Townes Van Zandt.

Kicking off Stagecoach Days '80 will be a fashion show Friday at 7:30 p.m. in the Old Courthouse Museum. The show features old fashions from the collection of Martha Thomas. Admissions will be a \$3.75 donation to the Harrison County Museum endowment fund.

The Amity Theatre will present "The Odd Couple" Friday and Saturday at the City Hall Auditorium. The play will begin at 8 both nights.

The arts and crafts fair will be both Saturday and Sunday on the square around the old courthouse. Over 100 exhibitors will display paintings, ceramics, foods, gifts and handiwork.

The Harrison County Conservation Society will sponsor an arts show Saturday and Sunday in the parking lot of the Ginnocchio Hotel. Open to artists is and over, the show will contain oil paintings, water-media, drawings, prints, photography and sculpture. Works will be accepted Friday, between 9 a.m. and noon at the Office of Tourism and Convention Development located in the Ginnocchio Hotel. Entry fee is \$4 per work.

A mini-marathon will begin Saturday's activities at 8 a.m. Two races, a mile-long run for younger participants and a four-mile race for other entrants, will be held and awards will be given to the first, second and third place finishers in each age and sex division. The four-mile run will begin at First Baptist Church on Austin and Fuller streets and will wind through downtown Marshall to a finish line at Peter Whetsome Square.

At 11 a.m. Saturday, the Seven Flags Transportation parade will start up at the Marshall Public Library. The colorful parade will contain a variety of entries including stagecoaches, horses, old autos and other modes of transportation. Plaques will be awarded in a number of different categories.

Singer Townes Van Zandt will headline the Seven Flags Show Saturday at the Civic Center, singing original songs and compositions by famed bluesman Leadbelly. Van Zandt is the great-grandson of Isaac Van Zandt, a prominent Marshallite who served as ambassador to the United States during the days of the Republic of Texas.

Representing Mexico during the show will be dancers from the Ballet Americana de Mexico, a young troupe of dancers dressed in their native costumes. Mrs. W. P. Palmer, daughter of U.S. Rep Sam B. Hall, will sing "The Yellow Rose of Texas" and will present roses to dignitaries in the audience. Admission to the show will be \$5.

Throughout Stagecoach Days, a number of historic homes will be open for tours. Some of Marshall's finest old homes, including Edgemont, Gregg House, Adams House and Allen House, will be open for the tours. Tickets may be purchased at the Old Courthouse Museum or Allen House.

Also on hand for the festivities will be Big John Brigham and his two Butterfield stagecoaches. Brigham will provide rides on the Chilesdale-powered coaches during the festival.

Mountaineer Days set for East Mountain area

EAST MOUNTAIN — Residents of this south Upshur County community are preparing for the second annual "Mountaineer Days" to be held Saturday, May 17 near the old East Mountain school and the East Mountain Men's Club.

Headliners for the Saturday afternoon event include A.J. McCallough and his band, the Friendly Four, and East Mountain's own country and western singing barber, Tommy Brasher, according to Jo Poppa, coordinator of the event.

Mrs. Poppa promised "a lot of things going on for all ages and good food at reasonable prices" at the event, which she styled as a good, old-fashioned, great town picnic.

The Friendly Four will kick off the festivities at 1 p.m., followed by the 1:30 p.m. crowning of the couple who have lived in the community the longest.

Games will include horseshoes, a dunking booth with city council members and some of the local ladies participating, cakewalks for adults, cupcake walks for children and an egg toss.

Tom Crosby's Youth Choir from East Mountain Baptist Church will entertain with old-time gospel tunes at 3 p.m., followed by a robbery writing contest for which several mountaineers are already practicing, with expectations of great expectations. Also on tap is a three-legged race.

After Brasher's performance at 4 p.m., all those present will be invited to participate in a giant tug of war. Mrs. Poppa promised the midweek mudhole in recent memory to separate the opposing sides.

"I always like to end up on a dirty note," she explained.

"When people leave here they will have laughed, eaten good food and had fun," she said.
