Kerrville festival stars listed

A festival that most fans of the Kerrville Music Festivals aren't always able to attend all of the days and nights each festival. They must pick the nights when their favorite musicians are scheduled. Therefore, FTA publishes the nightly schedules as early as possible for advance planning.

Producer Bud Kennedy has just released the lineup for the Kerrville Folk Festival, the first of this summer's events, and it appears below.

The 19th Kerrville Folk Festival, in celebration of its 10th anniversary, has been expanded to two weekends for a total of eight nights. There will be five nights during the Memorial Day holiday, Thursday through Monday, May 21-25, and three the next weekend, Friday through Sunday, May 29-31.

Advance tickets are on sale from the festival office with a 25 percent discount on each single night ticket and additional discounts on tickets for one or both entire weekends.

Tickets for Saturday nights only are not available this year. Saturday tickets will be sold only in conjunction with tickets for one or both entire weekends.

Early reservations for overnight accommodations in the Kerrville area are recommended.

The Texas State Arts and Crafts Fair, the largest in the state, will be May 29(1) the same days as the second weekend of the Folk Festival.

Casey Kasem: The voice with the Midas Touch

HOLLYWOOD, Calif. — Who is Casey Kasem?

To millions of people around the world, he's a voice on a radio program. To other millions, he's the host of a television program, a small, dark-haired guy who does short introductions to taped performance by pop stars.

And then there are the invisible Casey: the voice reading the commercial, the station-break, or the voice of Robin on the "Sage Frenchie" animated cartoon show.

Not the most flamboyant career in show biz, perhaps, right? But NBC News reports that Kasem makes \$1 million a year, a figure he refuses to comment upon.

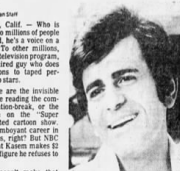
Even if he doesn't make that much, there is no doubting that Casey Kasem is a huge success story. His "American Top 40" show is heard in 129 stations nationwide and is heard in 35 percent of the country.

And that's not even counting the Armed Services Network, which broadcasts it in U.S. servicemen's areas around the world.

One would think he's very content, and one would be wrong.

"I've satiated myself in the area. I've worked to expand my horizons. I've been able to start work at advertising production facility in Hollywood. That's what I really want to be known for in my acting."

But then, it's been a chore working up from his part in radio dramas like "Sergeant Preston of the Yukon" and "The Lone Ranger" in Detroit to being the voice with the Midas touch.

Casey Kasem started out as a disc jockey, naturally enough, and he took the opportunity to figure everything he could about the business. "I taught me how to talk," he says.
