### Folk Music Festival in Vancouver brings talent spill-off to Seattle

ancouver, B.C., will hold its fourth annual Folk Music Festival — one of the largest in North America — this weekend, and Seattle will share in its wealth of talent

A number of artists scheduled for the festival will stop over here before or after.

One is Sweet Honey in the Rock, a black, female vocal quartet from Washington, D.C., who will perform at 8 p.m. tomorrow in the Moore Theater.

The group sings a cappella, accompanying itself with a few percussion instruments. It blends traditional African rhythms with contemporary folk and gospel harmonies

The group's lyrics often deal with black concerns, women's rights and liberation movements. But its concerts are not serious affairs — they are lively, upbeat and usually involve audience participation. The group was featured in the "No Nukes" concert, film and soundtrack.

Tickets for tomorrow's concert, priced at \$6, are available at The Bon Ticket Place and suburban

Hot Rize, one of the nation's finest bluegrass bands, plays at 8:30 p.m. July 23 in the Seattle Concert Theater. The Colorado quartet empha-

sizes classic bluegrass as played by Flatt & Scruggs. The band took its name from the "miracle ingre-dient Hot Rize" in Martha White

dient Hot Rize" in Martha White Flour, which sponsored Flatt & Scruggs on the Grand Ol' Opry in the 1950s and '60s.

The group is made up of four exceptional musicians. Pete ("Dr. Banjo") Wernick is a leading banjo player and teacher who has written several popular instruc-tion guides. He is known for his

innovative playing style.

Tim O'Brien, the fiddler, is a versatile musician and singer. Charles Sawtelle, the guitarist, also has a fine singing style. Nick Forster is the band's bass player, harmony vocalist and witty em-

Elizabeth Cotten, 88, a legend in American folk music, and Mike Seeger, a founder of the New Lost City Rambiers, will share the bill at 8 p.m. July 25 in Pigott Auditorium at Seattle University.

Cotten is a living repository of folk and blues. She is the author of "Freight Train," a folk classic, and sings traditional spirituals, ragtime, country blues and songs dating back to slavery.

Seeger has been a leading

performer and collector of rural Southeastern traditional music since the 1950s. His music is that of mountain farmers, mill workers and coal miners, which evolved into bluegrass and country-Western music. Seeger plays fiddle, banjo, guitar, dulcimer, mandolin, autoharp, jew's-harp, panpipes

and harmonica.


