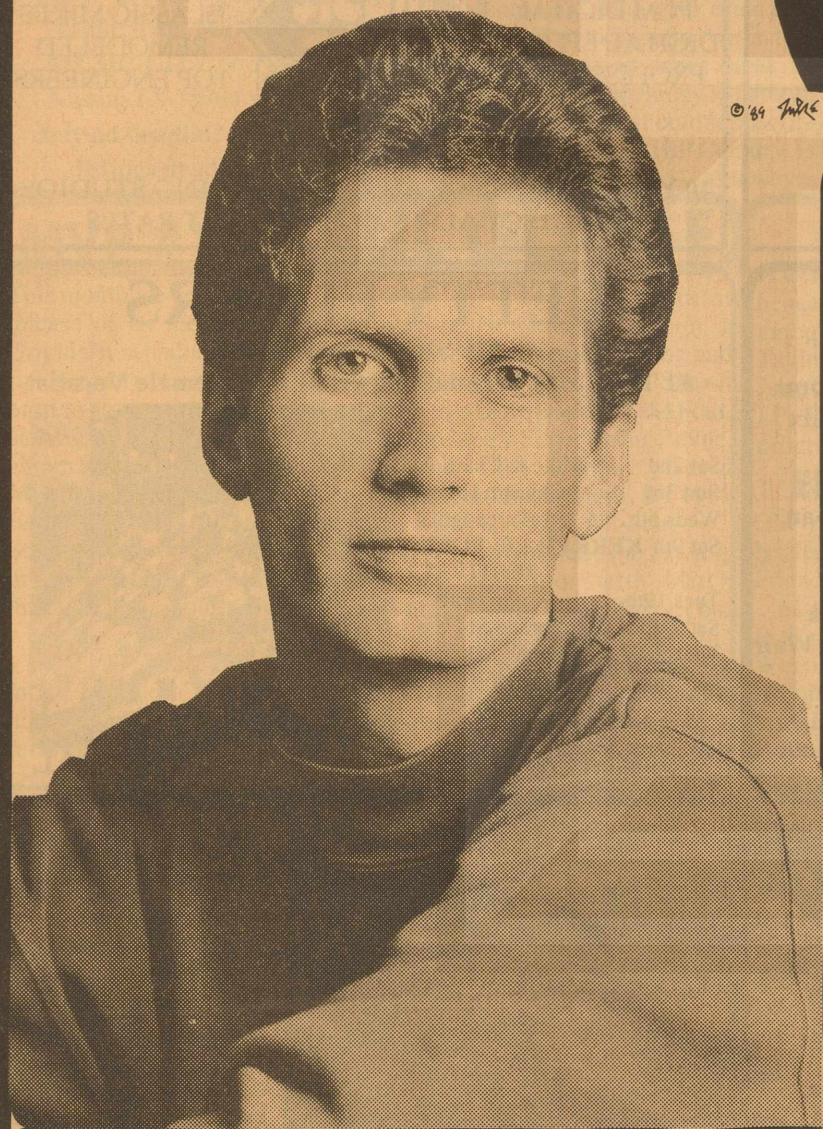

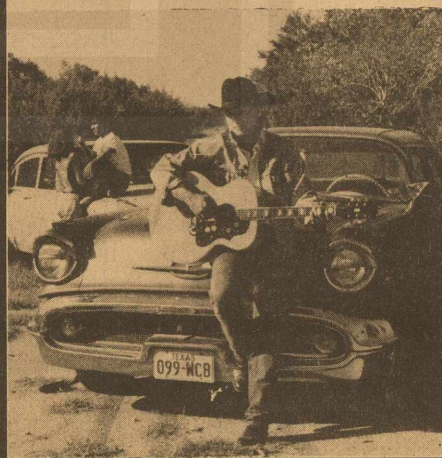

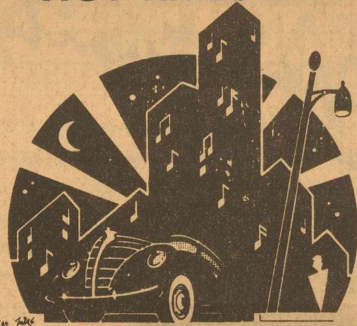

DIM LIGHTS, SMALL CITY COWTOWN BOOGIE

We're getting a *leetle* teed off by what seems to be misfocused (or ill-conceived) entertainment editorial direction in music city's daily. At MC we disagree among ourselves about rap, plugged week after week in the *Statesman*, but we all agree that most of the coverage doesn't have a lot to do with Austin. Whether rap's a valid form of popular Performance Art or a dead-end Big City Instant Fame fad that devalues real musical ability (our two extremes), either way we wish a similar effort went into promoting Texas music.

• But mainly we wonder what happened to AA-S's Buy Greater Austin promotion? The question is prompted by instances such as the recent dedication of mucho inches to promoting Madonna's mega-expensive *Houston* and *Dallas* shows and by the collective rap on the knuckles we all got for not buying tickets for David Bowie's Austin concert. Their argument is that by ignoring this ground-breaking [sic] multimedia presentation (what about the music?), we're ensuring no more "top drawer super tours" will ever come to Austin. Hey, guys, we could live with that. Precious little of that money stays in Austin anyway.

• An out-of-town event that *does* pull \$\$ into Austin is the Kerrville Folk Festival, which this year extends two weeks into June. Mid-week often finds Kerrverts from all over the world trekking into Austin to sample our fabled club scene and to get an urban break from rustic campsites. Local music fans are lucky to have an event of this caliber in their backyard and should support it—even getting there, through the spectacular Hill Country, is inspirational. Music City'll see you there and—as always—at the *local* music. (817/923-5438)

The Fort Worth/Dallas chapter of the Texas Music Association is putting on monthly showcases for up and coming Texas bands; High Noon and Linden Sherwin featured in the May kick off, with the Rhythm Rats booked for June. Chapter prez and Dallas promoter Phyllis Arp has decreed minimal expences, so Austin bands will feel right at home, but MC is happy to give the series a plug because the director is ace nice guy Ed Miller of Texas Productions, known in Austin as The Other Ed Miller, to distinguish him from the Colorado St Cafe's Irish-Scottish Jam host who, in turn, is known in DFW as The Other, an exchange of courtesies between our two communities. Ed, a fellow of fine sensitivity and taste, is anxious to get Austin bands involved in this attempt to unify the Texas music scene, so if you fancy some Metroplex exposure, send him a tape. MVP #10 PAUL GLASSE

This month we celebrate the non-release of an independent tape. Originally scheduled for June, the first project to carry Paul Glasse's name as leader rather than sideman, *The Tilt*, a stunning jazz album featuring his "dream band," Mitch Watkins guitar, Gene Elders fiddle, Bill Ginn piano, Spencer Starnes bass and AD Mannion drums, is exciting so much interest that Glasse is holding off for a while to see what develops.

• If we had a few extra pages, we might be able to squeeze in the highlights of Glasse's performing, recording, competition and press credits, but the bottom line is that if you're thinking of taking up electric mandolin, you might also consider leaving Texas because you're going up against a man who has single-handedly established the idea of mandolin as a lead instrument way beyond the confines of bluegrass and who is rapidly developing a national Mark O'Connor/Jerry Douglas style lock-out reputation as the master of his instrument.

• The youngest of a group of Poughkeepsie Junior High students turned on to bluegrass by local hero Dan Del Santo, Glasse took up mandolin because there

were already enough guitar players. He moved to Austin in 1977 to play Western Swing and soon got involved with Shawn Colvin's Dixie Diesels, Take Four, Al Dressen's Super Swing Revue, Jimmie Dale Gilmore, David Halley and Suzie Stern. By 1981 he was a Kerrville All-Star.

• Western Swing led to jazz swing, bebop and duos with Mitch Watkins and Brad Terry, but Glasse has revved up his leadership role during the last six months, various size combos bearing his name becoming a regular part of the Austin jazz scene. Not knowing any mandolin tunes at the time, the first thing he ever played was an original, and his current aim is to combat a local tendency to jazz formulae with ensemble playing round original compositions.

• In this he's undoubtedly helped by his offbeat instrument. When he first arrived, Glasse had to sell not just his abilities but the very idea of mandolin. Now he's an essential element of the sound of artists like Hal Michael Ketchum and Christine Albert who come to him not because they want a mandolin as such but because they want a superlative lead player. TEXAS HYMNAL #10

A formative figure in the development of the Houston folk sound, and hence of modern Texas music, credited as a major influence by, among others, his ex-wife Nanci Griffith and David Rodriguez, Eric Taylor pays a rare visit to Austin, performing at The Cactus Cafe on June 9th. Our hymn comes from his only album, a 1981 independent LP, *Shameless Love*, though much prized tapes of a new work in progress have started surfacing among his many songwriter fans.



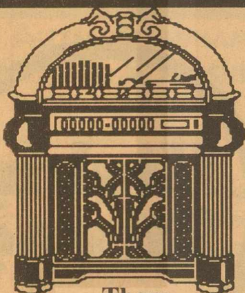


GREAT JUKEBOXES OF AUSTIN #7

THUNDERCLOUD BIERGARTEN

After a short break, due to lack of suitable candidates, GJBs of A returns for your listening pleasure.

• Even for fans of the funky, the Thundercloud's Riverside Drive Biergarten used to be a bit strong, but new broom Ernie has swept the floors, cleaned the windows, scrubbed the tabletops and cleared the cobwebs out of the jukebox. His digital Rockola 488 is a bit short, in fact totally lacking, in Texas music but long on not-so-obvious rock classics. The current heavy plays are Bob Dylan's *Tangled Up In Blue*, B-52s' *Love Shack* and Deep Purple's *Hush*, which may tell you something about the regulars, but there's no shortage of candidates for your dollar, which buys you no less than eleven plays (5 for 50¢, 8 for 75¢, hell of a good deal), plus there's a Bonus When Flashing thingy, but Ernie says he's not sure it's ever kicked in and doesn't know what would happen if it did. Anyway, out with the quarters and punch up:

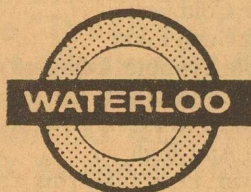

BRIAN CUTEAN LUBRICATING THE SPECIES

(independent cassette)

Brian's back in town . . . which reminds us that his sensitivity and sensibility have been missing for three whole years. Just before his departure to Portland, Oregon, Brian recorded at New Horizon's studio here, joined by good friends and musical comrades. The result showcases Brian's superb songwriting (plus vocal, guitar, harmonica abilities) with 6 cuts—all above average in their conception and execution. His music embraces New Age earth consciousness without the usual sappiness or preaching, couched in simple, fresh instrumentation (e.g., Larry Roark's euphonium). Other players are Robert Vignaud (upright bass), Steve Edwards (viola), Steve Whitfield (tablas), Ike Eichenberg (mandolin), Nicki Cutean and Sara Warner (vocals), Mark Williams (fretless bass), Gerald Eli Smith (recorders), Thomas Hart (guitar) and Jerry Stevens (elec. keyboard). Deftly mixed with Stew Urbach's assistance, this is easy listening for hip ears.

BARRY RODRIGUEZ & BR-549 • LET'S DANCE

(independent cassette)

Easy listening, eclectic exploration, all original. The band moniker is a give-a-way for a Texas bouquet featuring saxist Tomas Ramirez and percussion wizard Frosty. Rodriguez pens obviously heartfelt sentiments, expressed in a straightforward, gentlemanly manner, percolating into a tasty jazzy pop rock mix. Recorded on 2 tracks with no overdubs, this basically live tape, engineered by Richard Mullen, was done as a demo but Rodriguez was encouraged to release it. Outstanding are the Rodriguez-Ramirez instrumentals. This band likes 5.55 tracks and doesn't hesitate to stretch it out while smoking—check out *Groovacious*. *You Gotta Talk To Me* is perfect MoR, a slow dance-floor thriller. *You Been Lying* is radio ready, I'd love to hear Robert Cray cover it. *Honey, Let Me Know How You Feel* is a long time live favorite. Lovely, jazzy ballad *I'm Talking About Love* is most danceable. Stylistically diverse. Recommended.

HAYWIRE I'M READY

(independent cassette)

An apology first; I wrote Haywire off as yet another of those C&W Top 40 bands that I think of under the generic name of Porky & The Piglets, but, while they still seem to be uncertain what they want to be, the year-old septet (three vocalists) has more taste, talent and ambition than your average cover band. They may have to pull out obvious crowd-pleasers at some gigs, but their five track sampler takes in The Monkees' *Last Train To Clarksville, Texas Blues* (very pretty vocals by Lisa Farnham), Gib Guilbeau's *I'm Ready*, Bill Browder of Denim's *I'd Be Lost Without You* and Commander Cody's classic but rarely heard redneck stomper *Too Much Fun* and features some fine playing, particularly by fiddler Mary Egen Hattersley. No sign here of them coming up the kind of material that distinguishes the Jimmie Dale Gilmore/Kimmie Rhodes premier league, but Haywire could easily develop into a satisfyingly eclectic and offbeat roadhouse band.

SHINJI TONOMURA (import)

I'm turning Japanese. I think I'm turning Japanese . . . I've listened to this one so much lately, I'm almost understanding the words—and all but one cut is in Japanese. When I met Shinji last year during his Austin visit, he told me he was a songster who was a fan of Joe Ely, Butch Hancock and Jimmie Dale Gilmore and that he aspired to write and sing 'roots' music like theirs. Frankly, it was a bit hard to believe, but last month his producer, Yoshio Nakayama, brought us advance copies of Shinji's debut recording. In cuts ranging from cowboy ballads to country rock to Cajun to a hot cover of *Great Balls of Fire* (in English), this young artist proves he understands his chosen art form and has the talent to brand it with his own originality. The production is orientally impeccable and the backing players accomplished. Perhaps soon Mr Tonomura can return from faaar East Texas to his musical mecca so we can enjoy some live performances. Don't miss it when he does.

JAMES OLIVER WAYS & MEANS

(independent cassette)

Best known as co-leader of local political folk-rockers Rojo, Puerto Rican raised Oliver, out on his own, has added a pop element to that band's Hispanic rock & roll style on his four track MARS recorded cassette EP, co-produced with engineer Charlie Hollis. By their covers you shall know them, I always say, and the only non-original, Lou Reed's *Hanging Around*, which, with accordion supplying the rhythm line, comes across like some kind of demented sea shanty from the deck of The Flying Dutchman, seems a pretty clear signifier of what Oliver's about (along with a dedication to, among others, REM). But, while Oliver brings a definite and convincing edge to Reed's urban *weltschmerz*, his own material is more political. Which doesn't mean clenched fist agitprop; *Need Some Room (To Cut You Down)* and *These Are The Days* are elliptical and reflective, moods not manifestoes. The Reed cover alone goes a long way to repaying a right-on price of \$2.99.

ALLEN STEADHAM DREAMS & WISHES

(independent cassette)

At first glance, I wasn't sure I should review this tape. It has several elements I often loathe—programmed drums, synthesized keyboards, several instrumental-only cuts—plus a youthful artist obviously fond of studio-created music. An initial listen quickly overcame my bias. Steadham cut his musical teeth with UT-based *Edge of Slumber*, playing keyboards, bass and lead guitar plus providing lead vocals. He brings those skills to this solo release and combines them, ably assisted by Randy McCullough, with 9 original songs. Obviously influenced by keyboard-heavy dance music bands, this tape's diversity and songwriter potential retrieve it from the Muzak category for me. Nuvo-techno-turk Allen is involved in all aspects of this production from mixing to tape wrap art. This old hippie was especially attracted to the poli-sci-fi content of the songwriting—this appears to be Future Folk, a youthful, hopeful talent worth keeping an ear on.

DOING IT JESSE'S WAY

(Broken Spoke, cassette)

The credits on this tribute to the late Jesse Ashlock, original Texas Playboys fiddler and a patron saint of Austin music, speak for themselves. Of ten Ashlock songs, Willie Nelson takes two, including *Still Water Runs The Deepest*, Texas Playboy vocalist Leon Rausch four, Alvin Crow three and Kimmie Rhodes one, with all star support by Johnny Gimble, Alvin Crow and Erik Hokkanen on fiddle, Jimmy Day and Herb Remington on steel, Marcia Ball and Danny Levin on piano, Paul Glasse on mandolin, Rick Crow and Joe Gracey on guitar, Tiny McFarland and Neal Clausnitzer on drums, Jon Blondell on trombone and David Zettner (whose artwork needs an LP sleeve to do it justice) on bass, plus Al Dressen's Super Swing Revue as the rhythm section. Produced by Evie Ashlock and Joe Gracey, comment is virtually superfluous. Another Rhodes track would have sharpened the balance, but I'll tell you what, that's a minor quibble about a prime cut of authentic Texas country music.

1st • KIM WILSON + SUE FOLEY (Antone's). Kim month at the old stomping ground, with the T-Bird frontman gigging on June 2nd, 11th, 18th and 25th. This one has bonus support by hot new Antone's signing.

2nd • THERAPY SISTERS + DR JOE (Chicago House). Double dose Music & Laughter Clinic consultation. The witty, engaging Sisters have terrific oddball harmonies, some fine picking by Rogers and clever comic timing. New Yorker Joe Waldbaum's tape includes *The Ballad Of Dan Quayle* ("not a single Indiana town fell into Commie hands"), *Fax Me Your Love* and *Buddy, Can You Co-Sign A Loan?*

3rd • CHANCES 8TH ANNIVERSARY MUSIC FESTIVAL (Chances). In which the relaxed Red River store, with its fab natural amphitheater stage, lays serious claim to be Austin's cutting edge electric venue with 12 hours of house regulars that stomp most 6th St offerings.

3rd • AUSTIN KLEZMORIM (Magnolia Cafe South). An almost unique public appearance by the rabbis of rhythm with their kosher brand of Jewish jazz, featuring many of the top line Austin jazzers who played on their tape, *Shalom Y'All* (reviewed last issue). Think you've heard it all? Think again.

3rd • BUDDY MONDLOCK + BETTY ELDERS (Chicago House). In three years Mondlock went from Kerrville campfire to New Folk winner to New Folk judge. A songwriter for the 90s, teamed with MC's favorite lady, Best Female Songwriter & Vocalist and Best Independent Tape in our 1989 poll, deeply moving and intelligent lyrics.

6th • RUBEN RAMOS & THE TEXAS REVOLUTION (Auditorium Shores). Free show (another on the 24th) with the Tex-Mex legend.

7th/8th • HOUND DOG TRIO (Hole In The Wall/Headliners East). Country-blues songwriter Erik Moll, monster fiddler Erik Hokkanen with bassman Cowboy Dick play their last Austin gigs before taking off to spend the summer in Wyoming with Bobby Bridger's *Ballad Of The West* theater show.

8th • KERRVILLE FOLK FESTIVAL. MC's resident Kerrvert (EM) pegs this as the outstanding night of the folkathon, with musicologist David Amram as a guaranteed thriller, the extraordinary Afro-American four voice Casselberry-Dupree as a unique, knock your socks off experience, plus the delightful Tish Hinojosa, new Texan Peter Rowan, Peter Yarrow, Bill & Bonnie Hearn and David Rea.

9th • HUDSON & FRANKE + ERIC TAYLOR (Cactus). Two fine vocalists and even finer harmonisers with a remarkable Texan and American traditional folk song repertoire, this gig is made special by a rare (average once a year) Austin appearance by the elusive Taylor (see Texas Hymnal).

9th • KIMMIE RHODES BAND (Broken Spoke). The Briarcliff Nightingale is the female equivalent of Jimmie Dale Gilmore, with a

distinctive voice that may not meet opera standards but is pure country, and we don't mean that stuff that comes out of Nashville. Her set is enriched by striking originals but she also brings depth and passion to standards.

10th • DAVID RODRIGUEZ + JOHN CARRICK + MICHAEL ELWOOD, BETH GALIGHER & MIKE WILLIAMS (Chicago House). Last month's MVP, the reemerged and brilliant Rodriguez is among an elite handful of singer-songwriters every aspect of whose work, writing, singing and playing, is uniquely individual and powerful. Elwood, with very strong flute and BIG body guitar support, is perhaps the most literary, not to say literate, songwriter in Austin.

15th/16th • AUSTIN LOUNGE LIZARDS (Cactus). Gimmick of the month this time is the manic bluegrass comedians' 10th year anniversary weekend. Expect the usual fine picking, lots of laughs and many special surprises.

15th • JOHN DELAFOSSE & THE EUNICE PLAYBOYS (La Zona Rosa). The beat never stops from the moment the surprise hit band of this year's New Orleans Jazz & Heritage Festival strikes up its Zydeco storm.

15th • CHRIS O'CONNELL & JON EMERY'S HILLBILLY ALL STARS (Broken Spoke). Fusing the melodic, vocals-oriented approach of Ethyl & Methyl with the thundering r&r rhythms of The Jon Emery Band, plus Junior Brown's blistering double-neck guitar/lap steel and Floyd Domino on piano, guaranteed to be unusual, potentially amazing.

16th • ALEJANDRO ESCOVEDO ORCHESTRA (Hole In The Wall). Celebrating the Hole's 17th Anniversary (actually 16th, but who's counting?), last month's joint MVP and his high class acoustic ensemble play reflective, melodic variants of the ex-True Believer's rock material.

16th • BRIAN CUTEAN (Chicago House). Au revoir performance by the former Austinite, returning to Portland, Oregon. See Reviews.

17th • TINA MARSH & THE CREATIVE OPPORTUNITY ORCHESTRA (Laguna Gloria Amphitheatre). Event of the month. CO2's annual avant-garde mind-blower defies categories though they call it "alternative music." Combining precision and spontaneity, their large ensemble original compositions provide an extraordinarily exciting framework for outstanding solo work, notably the brilliant wordless scat/yodel/bebop of Ms Marsh.

17th • BUTCH HANCOCK & FRIENDS (Antone's). A welcome Sunday night alternative (also 24th), Antone's giving the great singer-songwriter free rein and not really knowing what to expect, but Lubbock Mafiosi Jimmie Dale Gilmore and Jesse Taylor wouldn't be a total surprise.

21st • ETHYL & METHYL (Steamboat). Chris O'Connell and Maryann Price, two of Austin's classiest ladies with hillbilly humor, sensational vocals, fine playing on big body guitar and cocktail drum, fashion tips and

more, joined by Rick McRae, exceptional guitarist with George Strait's touring band.

22nd • ESTABAN JORDAN Y SU RIO JORDAN (La Zona Rosa). The greatest and wildest accordion player in the world with his revved-up, no holds barred brand of conjunto.

23rd • PAUL GLASSE & FRIENDS WHO SING (La Zona Rosa). Our MVP usually gets called for gigs, this time he's done the calling, to Hal Michael Ketchum (see 30th), Chris O'Connell (see 15th & 21st), Kimberly M'Carver, a wonderful Houston-based singer-songwriter and long time associate Scott Neubert, dobro, guitar & steel wiz whose fine voice is seldom heard.

23rd • JIMMY LAFAVE BAND (Chicago House). Rare full evening with the soulful singer and gifted writer, also a remarkable interpreter of other people's songs, who'll have to dig into a songbook normally nine-tenths dormant. Larry Wilson of Barb Donovan's Breakers and harp/bass about town Randy Glines help out Gene Williams in support.

24th • MONTE WARDEN & THE WAGGONEERS (Hole In The Wall). Past-all-hope reunion in aid of a Buddy Holly monument for Austin, best case will combine Warden's new songs with his old outfit, worst case will be an unlooked for chance to hear this much missed band in its original format.

24th • POOR YORICK (Austin Outhouse). House band for an insane asylum's tape release party for *Comedies & Tragedies*, reviewed last issue with the advice "Buy this—forget Randy Newman."

26th • PAM & PIPO HERNANDEZ (Colorado St Cafe). The power behind Toqui Amaru, Pam's spine-tingling voice and Pipo's Latin guitar stylistics can reduce this busy restaurant to pin-drop silence.

27th • LUBBOCK LIGHTS (Continental). Annual Flatlander free for all with a hard core of Davis McLarty of the Ely Band, David Halley and David Holt plus whoever shows up—possibles are Texana Dames, Johnny X, Tex Thomas, Ponty Bone.

28th • FREDDIE STEADY'S WILD COUNTRY (Sholz Garden). Czech-Tex Bohunk funk with Fred Krc, just back from the old country with his off-the-wall honky-tonk, a single and album of which are due out in Czechoslovakia this summer.

29th • BUTCH HANCOCK & JIMMIE DALE GILMORE (Cactus). Reprising their recent and hugely successful British tour, two of Austin's master musicians, associates since Lubbock High School, combine their enormous talents.

30th CHRISTINE ALBERT (Waterloo Ice House/6th). The beautiful voice of Ms A (also to be heard on KUT's Folkways and KFIT's Talking About Music earlier in the day) will finally be raised in celebration of the delayed-by-gremlins release of her independent album, *You Are Gold* (to be reviewed next ish).

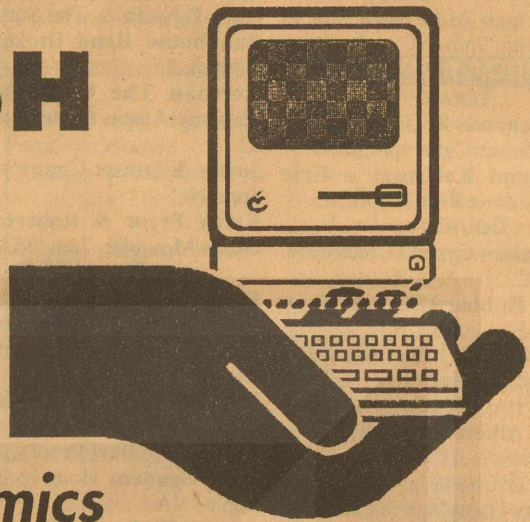

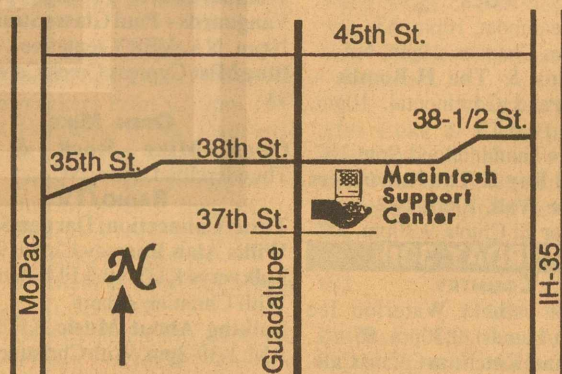
