The downtown dance club Jazzberries will try "live" music for the first time on Sunday, Oct. 6. Don't be surprised if it becomes a regular

A club spokesman told us last week that the Dwight Street hotspot, which is packed for dancing on Fridays and Saturdays, will test the band market with Urban Renewal. The group, which played every Wednesday for about 18 months at Sheehan's Cafe in Northampton, is known for a fiery, danceable fusion of jazz and rock.

The Jazzberries source said that the spiffy room will use the "live' format every Sunday through October and November. He also whispered that if the "live" Sunday concept is a hit, the club will con-

The addition of nearby Jazzberries to the Sunday groove will provide a nice walking tour for downtown nightclubbers.

With a different lineup, Urban Renewal released a cassette album, "Adventures in Suburbia," about two years ago. The group also is well known for backing up Mitch Chakour.

Cummings tells us that the new trio will emphasize jazz more than past incarnations have.

Mid-week best bets: There will be heavy action in Northampton and Westfield on Thursday. In 'Hamp, singer/songwriter Kenny Rankin will perform 7 and 10 p.m. sets at the Iron Horse Coffeehouse, while the Stompers rock nearby at Pearl Street. In the Whip City at 252 Elm Pub, ex-Platter Herb Reed will lead the charge into a night of "oldies."

On Wednesday, Pearl Street and the Red Balloon in Easthampton will stir it up. Eight to the Bar will return to the 'Hamp site, while the Balloon has a barnburner with the Fabulous Heavyweights and the Bamboo Steamers.

For the Iron Horse, it will be another classic week. Tonight at 7 and 10, singer/songwriters Rosalie Sorrels and Townes Van Zandt will appear in a sizzling twin-bill; and on Wednesday, the monthly Comedy Crunch "open stage" for budding comics will be on tap.

Jazzberries goes 'live' AIDS hurting gay actors?

SAG executives will meet this week with representatives of The Alliance of Motion Picture and Television Producers to determine discrimination homosexuals is fact or simply

It's a touchy subject. First of all, despite the bravado



of the gav liberation front and other homosexual organizations, only a minority of gay actors and actresses — and no major stars have really come out of the Hollywood closet.

Few if any gay performers, and there are hundreds, would be willing to file a complaint with SAG stating they have suffered employment discrimination because they are gay and suspected of having AIDS.

Nor is it likely producers will demand of prospective cast members whether they are homosexual or if they have AIDS.

And if producers did ask, could they expect straight answers?

Certainly, there are prominent actors who are well-known homosexuals in the Hollywood community, but whose sexual preference - if it can be called preference is unknown to the rest of the country.

Perhaps if some of them became glaringly unemployed there might be grounds for rumors about discrimination against gays.

Ed Asner, president of SAG, says

he has heard stories about discrimination since Rock Hudson went public two months ago with the fact that he is an AIDS victim. "But I haven't heard of a loss of

jobs for gays suspected of having AIDS," Asner said from the Chicago location of his new CBS-TV movie, "Following The Footsteps."

"There has always been some discrimination about homophobia without involving AIDS at all. The guild is engaging in preventive medicine in meeting with the producers. We want to nail down a means of addressing the problem if it should arise.

"If there is evidence of job discrimination due to homosexuality regarding AIDS, we won't be waving our hands in the air trying to decide which way to go."

The SAG contract language clearly prohibits hiring discriminaon the basis of preference

Asner says there is a certain amount of panic involved in the community that cannot be substantiated.

of having AIDS.

"I think unless someone is proven to be ill, he or she should not be denied work," he said.

Would Asner object to working with an AIDS victim? Would he do a love scene with an actress suffering

"Well," he said, "I wouldn't want to work closely with someone suffering from tuberculosis. With AIDS it would be difficult for me to decide which way to go. We're bombarded with conflicting medical "The New York Times ran a story

putting to rest a lot of fears about AIDS, but the next day a leading AIDS expert denied much of what was printed. So I'd think twice about doing a love scene with a woman AIDS victim. I would work with such a person. But I don't know about kissing. It hasn't been established.

"I want to make it clear I'm disvictims, cussing AIDS homosexuals."

What Asner and every other actor and actress must deal with is the knowledge that if they are working with a homosexual, is there a possibility that individual has AIDS.

Hudson knew he had AIDS when he was doing love scenes with Linda Evans, but he didn't tell her or, presumably, anyone else in the "Dynasty" cast.

Actress Bo Derek vehemently denies she ever said she would demand that her leading man take a test before doing love scenes.

"That was a false story." the blonde beauty said. "I've never said such a thing and I would never stoop to asking anyone to take any sort of medical test as a condition of working with me.'

SAG spokesman Kim Felner said the guild has not been flooded with calls from either homosexuals objecting to discrimination straight actors fearful of getting AIDS from a co-star.


