'The Headhunters' Superior Drama on Broadway

WASHINGTON (AP) — Although any similarity to recent literary events in Russia is strictly immaterial in "The Headhunters," playwright Henry Denker stands more than partisan social comment. With Anthony Quinn in impressive control as both star and director, the drama opened the other night at the Kennedy Center. It is a vivid, thought-provoking experience of steadily rising tension only slightly diluted by some melodramatic overkill. Quinn portrays a writer just home to Moscow after seven years in a Siberian work camp, the penalty for having spoken out in defense of some Jews. Quinn finds himself in a new vortex of peril because of his critical of Soviet life. It is not an embassial visitor arrives to urge another book be also released. Eventually the judgmented author, chronically ill because of prison eroding, rises to defy mounting KGB intimidation, planned bogged attacks and violent pressure by members of the writers union who he regarded as exponents of repression. A program note carefully asserts "the events in this play are fictional. Unfortunately the tyrants is not." There are several dialogue references to Boris Pasternak, Denker, however, makes his larger purpose clear as the protagonist recalls having once seen one of those ideational human heads fancied by certain jungle tribes. "The image persists me," says Quinn, "because it is the image of every writer in this country! And in every country where they would silence dissent."

"For always they start with writers. Why? Because once you have silenced writers you can silence scientists, teachers, philosophers, eventually whole nations. Yes, every nation has headhunters." The drama's suspense is flavored with episodes of domestic intimacy, touches of humor, and most importantly by the fierce, quiet characterizations of Quinn, Ann Williams, as his wife, and Greg Volkmer, a Swiss frontliner. The act by Ben Edwards, conductor by Jane Greenwood and lighting by Gilbert V. Hemley, Jr., create a proper Muscovite ambience. Let "The Headhunters" at superior, challenging drama.
