EVEN THOUGH THE 6TH ANNUAL Jimmie Rodgers Jubilee occurs Sept. 19, I'm going to start giving you some information now about the event. It is an important celebration nationwide because this year invitations will go out to the entire Jimmie Rodgers Memorial Association, based in Mississippi at the Center for the Study of Southern Culture. Press is invited from around the country to talk to the performers (many of them local) and to experience Kerrville's connection with music history.

Bill Tipton and Miller Beer, Rio Grande Music (Bert and Beverly Winston), and The Soap Opera Laundry are bringing in Riders in the Sky and Alvin Crow and the Pleasant Valley Boys.

I've already devoted an entire column to Riders, but I want to remind you, if you like will perform at 2 p.m. in a special children's concert based on an album they recorded especially for children. Ranger Doug, Too Slim and Woody Paul will entertain with their music and their stories and humor.

Alvin Crow and the Pleasant Valley Boys are listed in the Country Music Hall of Fame as representing the essential Western Swing so intricately connected to all Texas music. They share this recognition with Asleep at the Wheel. Alvin will sing your heart back to the cowboy while he fiddles. His band will get your feet to dancing at the pavilion on Schreiner College campus. Bring your lawn chairs for the day. Riders will perform again at 7:30 p.m. Wayne Kentener and the Texas Style will get you in the mood to dance at 8:30, and Alvin will put the king on the cake.

THE EVENT WILL KICK-OFF WITH Jimmie Rodgers' grandson, Jimmie Dale Court, performing at 10 a.m. Sure, that's early, but at Willie's picnic this year, and he takes part in festivals around the country. He will be featured on the Texas Heritage radio series on KEYL before Sept. 19. So some of you who are interested in traditional music being coming down from Iowa on the heels of his own has a list of credentials that could trail behind him all the way back to Iowa. He is head of the National Traditional Country Music Association; he's had a Grammy nomination; he has won 25 national country music contests; and the list goes on.

Bob has found a huge following in Europe where he won Entertainer of the Year for the Country Music Association in England. Bob explains, "I wanted to turn back to my roots. I want to preserve traditional country music that was popular before it was changed by Nashville." He shares these goals with Kerrville's Jubilee Committee.

The Kerrville committee consists of Mike Walker (founder of the Jubilee), Henry Young (co-founder and founder of the Jimmie Rodgers Memorial Association), Harry Farris, Merry Redding, Jim Morris, Jeff Seaford, Dwight Harkey, Robin Moses and Carl Murphy. Carl is in charge of volunteers to call him if you are interested.

OTHER ENTERTAINERS INCLUDE ROY HARPER from Tennessee. He has been featured on a number of albums to Rodgers and represented Tennessee's traditional music at the Smithsonian Festival of American Folklife. He also won first place at the Tennessee Valley State Championship Bluegrass Convention. He is known for his yodeling blues, and we will be in for a real treat with his performance.

I'll talk about the other performers in another column. They include Wilton Crider, Doug Davis and the Note Ropers, Roland Davis, the Poverty Playboys, James McMurry, Tom Swartzell (an annual favorite on the Dobro), Fris Tweste, Jesse Hamilton on fiddle, Van Williams on Louisiana, C. J. Berkman (railroad poet and Tivy English Teacher), and some surprise guests.

This year the Jubilee is sponsored by the Texas State Historical Association to raise money for a scholarship fund for students studying music. Artists in the area have donated pieces for a silent auction—all proceeds going into the scholarship fund. To give me more information, or to volunteer, or to ask questions, call 257-2486.
